1. Consideration of the Minutes of Proceedings for April 19, 2022

Treasurers Report:

- 5. Executive Director Update
 - a. COVID numbers are slowly going back up. One person in hospital.
 - b. State nursing contract has been received in draft form. We do not know the dollar amounts for the TANF portion of the contract.
 - c. The mosquito grant contract has been signed. It is \$15,000 more than last year and the same as it was in 2020.
 - d. The budget goes to first reading on May 18, 2022.

- e. The government is working with one of the producers for baby formula to get it back in production. Dr. Hartman stated it would be about mid-July before supplies are back to normal.
- f. Laramie and Natrona Counties are having a large number of Chlamydia cases.
